

The International Legal Framework

- The Geneva Convention, 1958
- The United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, 1982
- The International Maritime Organization, IMO, 1989
- London Dumping Convention, 1972
- Regional Conventions.



Pipelines and Flowlines

- Geneva Convention, 1958
 - Pipelines and flowlines not addressed as part of infrastructure.
- Law of the Sea Convention, 1982
 - No requirement to remove pipelines or flowlines.
 - Decommissioned pipelines is not considered as dumping
- **IMO Guidelines**, 1989
 - Do not address pipelines or flowlines
- National law
 - Most domestic laws do not address the issue
